Meeting called to order by Brian Thomas

Opening Prayer given by Mike Richardson.

Board of Director's Covenant

Brian distributed a copy of the 2015 Walk to Emmaus Covenant Letter that all board members need to sign. This will be completed and emailed back to The Upper Room.

Treasurer's Report

David Dzik presented Treasurer's Report as of July 31, 2015. He indicated there was not much activity last month. On the Balance sheet David pointed out an expense in July for \$1,288.00. This was the refund due to the bed bugs at Ceta of \$161.00 to eight sponsors. Another charge in July for \$2,407.12 was for supplies. David indicated this was for supplies for the last three walks and The Upper Room was delayed in billing us. Another charge under Other Costs of \$391.68 was for 90% of the air fare to Nashville for Jeff Beasley for the annual Emmaus meeting. David indicated Chrysalis paid the other 10% of the air fare.

David also shared the Treasurer's Report as of July 31, 2015 for Chrysalis. He indicated there was one caterpillar's cost from the last flight that was to be paid for by his church, but the payment hasn't been made yet. David also indicated the net income was down for the year for Chrysalis but also pointed out that they have not had their fund raiser yet. Chrysalis will be deciding on the fund raiser for one of the remaining community gatherings. That should bring the net income up for the year.

Motion to accept the Treasurer's Report was made by Pam Stork and seconded by Brenda Wilhite.

Minutes Approval

Minutes from the June 4, 2015 board meeting were previously distributed on email. Motion to accept the June minutes was made by Deborah Erwin and seconded by Kurt Oheim.

Walk #246

Lay Director – Scott Brittain – IBR Eddie Hill

Eddie reported they have had their last team meeting and final ALD meeting. They have a full team as of the last meeting. They have had difficulty filling the Assistant Music Director. Kelly Gazzaway

recently joined the team to fill the Assistant Music Director slot. Eddie also reported that Kelly paid his own walk fee and the fee for another team member who was unable to pay their fee. A motion was made by Ken Haney and seconded by Lisa Crossman to refund Kelly's walk fee to him and utilize a scholarship to pay his fee since he joined the team at the last minute. Eddie also announced that the Prayer Vigil and Agape Sign Up are both full for the walk.

Chrysalis Update

Deborah Erwin reported that the Chrysalis Board meeting for tonight was cancelled due to lack of quorum. She indicated they are in need of board members. Mardell's for books for walks

Brian reported that the assistant manager from Mardell's (Carol Duncan) contacted him regarding the process of purchasing books from them for the Emmaus walks. In the past, Mardell's has insisted that only one person be listed as the contact person for each walk and the books be distributed to that person. Ms. Duncan advised Brian that she is willing to be the contact person for the paperwork that needs to be completed for their corporate office. The board agreed on this as an additional source for books for the walk. Brian will complete the application for this.

DeFalco Concerns

Linda Astuto, Executive Director for DeFalco Retreat Center hosted our dinner tonight and took the board on a brief tour of a newly renovated bathroom and parlor. She presented an updated proposal for our board to consider moving our Emmaus walks back to DeFalco.

Brian suggested that each board member review the proposal and we will discuss it at the next board meeting.

Picture and video concerns posted on Facebook

Brian presented concerns again about pictures and articles appearing on Facebook about recent flights/walks. He will write another article for the newsletter to stress to everyone that details and pictures from flights/walks are not to be published on Facebook.

Other Discussion

Roger and Carolyn both discussed the need for more pilgrim applications. They both have approximately 10 applications each for the upcoming walks. This is the lowest number of applications we have ever had. We also had difficulty in getting commitments from Lay Directors and Spiritual Directors for 2016. The board was encouraged to think about how to get more pilgrims and more commitments from Emmaus leaders. One possibility was to reduce the number of walks per year from six to four.

Credit Cards for Emmaus walk fees

Roger and Carolyn also discussed the continued requests from the community to be able to pay for the walks with credit cards. Carolyn will discuss this with Lee Carter, our web designer, to see how we can accomplish this.

2015 WALK TO EMMAUS COVENANT LETTER

Between

The Upper Room International Walk to Emmaus/Chrysalis Office

And

Name of Community Golden Spread

STATE/COUNTRY Texas/USA

This agreement is hereby entered into this 5TH day of February, 2015

Hereinafter, "The Upper Room International Emmaus/Chrysalis Office" will be "the Emmaus/Chrysalis Office" and the other party, "the Local Community".

By signing this covenant,

The Local Community agrees:

- 1- to become an Upper Room "Walk to Emmaus Community" in accordance with the program's mission and vision.
- 2- to annually review and renew its Covenant with the Emmaus/Chrysalis Office.
- 3- to conduct the Emmaus program in accordance with the current copyrighted Upper Room Emmaus materials.
- 4- to foster in Emmaus activities the openness to diversity and the theological balance that is reflective of Upper Room Ministries which invites interdenominational, interracial and international participation, and fosters a spirit of Christian acceptance and unity.
- 5- to have an elected local governing body that will conduct its business in accordance with the Emmaus/Chrysalis Office guidelines and, in a manner that honors Christ and His church.
- 6- that all current Community Board of Directors members and all Weekend Conference Room members are active participants in a Group Reunion or accountability group.
- 7- to be in communication with the Emmaus/Chrysalis Office regarding scheduled Emmaus weekends, election of new officers and other developments affecting the quality of the Emmaus ministry.
- 8- to update and maintain their community's information on the Emmaus Boardroom website.
- 9- to refer to the Emmaus/Chrysalis Office for the interpretation of the Emmaus materials.
- 10- to seek prior written approval from the Emmaus/Chrysalis Office for translation of and/or printing of any and all Emmaus documents in any language.
- 11- to function entirely as a servant of the Church.
- 12- to cooperate with and keep denominational leaders, other church officials, and the Emmaus/Chrysalis Office informed about the activities and fruit of the local and international Emmaus Movement.

- 13- to have its books and records inspected annually by someone other than the treasurer. The ensuing written report will be entered into the minutes of the local governing body and made available to any interested party.
- 14- to support the work of the Emmaus/Chrysalis Office with a payment of US \$13.00 per pilgrim on an Emmaus weekend.
- 15- to actively support international communities through financial contributions to "THE GIFT" program.
- 16- to send all Board members, who have not previously attended one, to a Leadership Development Event.
- 17- to work through the Emmaus Regional Leaders to gain understanding of the movement for continual improvement.
- 18- to have an ongoing working relationship of involvement with their Chrysalis community if one is active within their area.
- 19- to consult with the Emmaus/Chrysalis Office to re-start after 3 years of dormancy.

The Emmaus/Chrysalis Office agrees:

- 1- to recognize the Local Community as a Walk to Emmaus Community in accordance with the program's Mission and Vision.
- 2- to develop, strengthen, and empower the partnership to fulfill our common vision and mission with the Local Community.
- 3- to commit to the upholding of each community, this covenant, and these global movements in prayer.
- 4- To grant permission to the Local Community to use the current copyrighted Walk to Emmaus name, program, and materials.
- 5- to make available to the Local Community training, guidance, and consultation; interpretative materials on Emmaus; direction and leadership for starting new Emmaus communities (or re-starting dormant ones); printed materials for leading all aspects of Emmaus; resource persons for leadership training; and coordination and networking of the expanding Emmaus movement throughout the world.
- 6- to support community members in their Fourth Day by making available, upon request, information about other Upper Room print, video and experiential resources for strengthening the spiritual life.
- 7- to grant to the Local Community a 25% discount on Upper Room books purchased for book tables at Emmaus events.
- 8- to maintain regular communication with the leadership of Local Communities.
- 9- to continually seek to improve the Emmaus program through a variety of means including an International Advisory Committee made up Emmaus and Chrysalis leaders from across the movement.

Background of the Bishop Defalco Retreat Center

The Bishop Defalco Retreat and Conference Center began as a dream of the late Lawrence M. DeFalco, who was installed as the Bishop of Amarillo in June of 1963. Sadly he never realized his dream of a Retreat Center due to his untimely death in September 1979. As his successor, Bishop Leroy Matthiesen, along with a team of two Redemptorist priests, took on the responsibility of seeing DeFalco's "dream come true."

Discussions of the plans for the Retreat Center began in October of 1980. Ground was broken in September of 1981 and operation began in November of 1982 while still under construction. A formal dedication and open house took place on December 12, 1982, bringing the Bishop Defalco Retreat Center to life.

The succeeding Bishops of the Amarillo Diocese, Bishop John W. Yanta (1997-2008) and Bishop Patrick J. Zurek (2008 – present) have always been very supportive of Bishop Lawrence DeFalco's dream of a Retreat Center, and its mission ... providing a refuge for those seeking spiritual and personal development.

At the time there was a question, "Can a retreat be made without going to the country?" This question has been positively answered after almost 35 years in operation and thousands of retreats successfully completed.

While owned by the Catholic Diocese of Amarillo, the Bishop Defalco Retreat Center is a Catholic Retreat Center with an ecumenical heart. We honor all denominations of the Christian tradition.

The purpose of the retreat center is to allow people to take time for what is truly valuable, to go to a beautiful space, filled with the art and heart of the church, and one that clearly says this is a move from the secular to the sacred, so that they can personally deepen their relationship with God, the Source and Goal of their lives.

Chapel	Our circular, adobe chapel sets itself apart from the rest of the facility. It is a sacred space where the acoustics are phenomenal and lighting can change its ambiance.
Dependable Facility	Though our facility is aging, we have a competent and dedicated maintenance staff that stays on top of keeping us in tip-top shape. Our diocese just completed a Capital Campaign and our Retreat Center will be receiving 1 million dollars for renovations, remodeling and improvements.
Staff who are easy to work with and dedicated to customer service	When it comes to customer service, this is where the BDRC shines. We are dedicated to making each client have a "10" experience each and every time they walk through the door. We are dedicated not only to providing a service with excellent customer service, but serving the needs of the human person with love and compassion.
AV Technology	Our meeting spaces have recently been updated with the latest in technological advancement in AV equipment and technology needs.
Sound System	We have a sound system in our chapel that Emmaus is welcome to use for their chapel services. This includes speakers, music stands, microphones and amps.

Additional Requirements

Emmaus may require onsite storage. Acts and Kairos Outside rent shed space on the back lot of the Retreat Center. If Emmaus would require extra storage of their supplies the BDRC is willing to investigate the purchase of a new storage building that the Emmaus Community could rent.

Requests

The following are requests of the Bishop Defalco Retreat Center:

- Please allow us to give you a formal tour and host one of your next board meetings.
- If terms were agreed upon, the Golden Spread Emmaus community would agree to stay at the Bishop Defalco Retreat Center for a period of 5 years to enable us to learn how to serve you more fully.
- We reserve the right to increase the fee after 2 years, not to exceed 5% per increase.
- We would hope that you might also consider using our facility to host your board meetings and your team meetings during the week. We could provide meal service with your meetings and it also allows the team to feel at home in our facility before the weekend of the actual retreat.
- We would welcome "Community" to meet at the retreat center each month (or however often you meet) and use our dining facility for your pot-luck meal, our meeting space for your board meeting and sponsor training, and our chapel for worship. If we arranged this as a regular event, we might even negotiate charging a minimal fee but have an offering taken up for the retreat center instead of charging our normal fee. Having Community at the Retreat Center might afford Emmaus continuity and people could enjoy coming back to the place they had their retreat. This might in turn keep people involved long after their "Walk."
